When our daughter, Abby, was born, it was a joyous occasion. She was the first grandchild on both sides of the family. Everything seemed new: new parents, new grandparents. Joy abounded. Then we brought Abby home from the hospital, and as I looked at her in the bassinet sleeping, I said, "Ok. Now what?"

"Now what?" It's an appropriate question to ask, especially after a period of joy in our lives. When things start returning to "business as usual," it's very common to let life go back to the way things were.

We've just celebrated Easter. The stories of the resurrection of Christ, His being raised from true death to new life, still reverberate in our brains. But after the hymns end, after the breakfasts are eaten, how many of us will ask: "Now what?"

What does it mean that Jesus rose from the dead? There are many traditional responses, but most often relate to when we die. What about now? What about while we are alive? What does it mean to us, and more specifically, how do we live our lives differently knowing that Jesus conquered the grave for all humanity?

We will be spending the next seven Sundays hearing and learning from the Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles, two books that are often believed to be written by a person or persons tradition calls "Luke." We will hear how the authors answered the question "Now what?" with the stories of the disciples who allowed themselves to be guided by the inspiration and power of the Holy Spirit. Hopefully we will hear answers to our "Now what?" questions for our lives today.

One thing is for certain. The answers to our "Now what?" questions will involve more than our individual selves, if we pattern our lives after the example of the scriptures - especially the Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles. As we live into these scriptural stories, may we be given new eyes to see, new ears to hear, and new bodies to work for the Kingdom of God - ushered into this world now through the power of the Resurrection.


TAKE CARE OF MY CHURCH
