We like predictability. We like being able to project hours, days, weeks, months, and years into the future. We like it, and we sometimes crave it. There is just something appealing about a well-humming engine. Even more so, there is something reassuring about turning the key and being almost guaranteed the engine will start.

We suspect predictability is one of the reasons people gravitate towards the Christmas season. Our traditions rarely change wildly from year to year. In addition, the date of Christmas is fixed. Every year, like clockwork, it arrives on December 25th, whether we are ready for it or not.

The same isn't true for Easter. Easter is not a set date on our calendar, even though some leaders of major Christian denominations are in talks to do that very thing. Rather, the date of Easter is calculated using a very strange formula. The end result is a wildly fluctuating date for Easter each year. This year, Easter is almost the earliest it can be - March 27th. When we were serving our first year in the pastorate, Easter was the earliest it could be - March 23rd. With Easter being so early, the season of Lent is just around the corner.

Now, Lent might still seem like a strange practice to some of you. Why, we might ask, is the purpose of giving up things for 40 days, only to do those things in excess on Easter and beyond? Indeed, isn't Lent just an old relic from the works-righteousness faith of Roman Catholics? Why should we Protestants even bother with Lent?

In a sense, it is silly to have a specific 40 day slot in which to give up chocolate or other vices. If these things are bad for us, shouldn't we be doing these things year round? Of course, we should. However, Lent can break through our monotonous predictability, if we let it. Just as we plant flowers in the spring to enjoy them in the summer, our faith life needs tilling and planting. Sometimes, we need something more than gradual preparation. Lent can be our boot camp of spiritual growth. We are invited to take a close look at ourselves in order to root out the weeds of sin and selfishness that may have grown during the past few months or years. The beauty of Lent is this: when we observe Lent together as a church, we can mutually encourage each other to become more faithful disciples. If I try to lose weight on my own, it is easy to get discouraged and give up. When I work with a team which also has the same goal, I am more motivated.

Our prayer for us this Lent is to grow spiritually, both in depth and in healing. May we learn once again to let go of those things which keep us far from God, and may we learn in the letting go to trust Jesus more completely. May we all observe a holy Lent, starting on Ash Wednesday, February 10th.
