A Note from your Pastors:

Whatwouldhappenifwewrotethisarticlewithoutanyspaces? Not only is it difficult to read, it is highly difficult to type without spaces. We need the pauses in order to see the words.

The same is true with our lives. We often say we should "count our blessings," but how can we count our blessings when we are feeling driven to go from one thing to the next as fast as we can go?

The scriptures give us many commandments. Some are easier to follow than others. Today, we'd like to talk about a commandment which seems impossible to follow.

Yes, we're talking about the commandment to take Sabbath. It's one of the big ten, yet so many people, Christians included, seem to disregard it. Not only that, Christians are often the ones cajoling others to break the Sabbath commandment. In this age of heated debates over morality, we find it troubling to see so many people talking others out of their weekly day of rest.

The ten commandments are listed twice in the Pentateuch, the first five books of the Bible. The first is in Exodus, chapter 20. The second is in Deuteronomy, chapter 5. Deuteronomy is a Greek word which can loosely mean "the second telling of the law." In looking at the Sabbath commandment, the reason for taking the break in Exodus is because God rested on the seventh day after creating all things. The reason for taking Sabbath in Deuteronomy is because the Hebrews were slaves in Egypt, and all need rest, even slaves.

We, in this culture, have allowed ourselves to become slaves of busy-ness. Some of us have done it willfully, while others are forced to work beyond six days a week in order to maintain a single job or work multiple jobs to put food on the table. While it might be "the way things are," not taking a weekly Sabbath is a breaking of one of God's top ten commandments. We Christians have a duty to both observe the Sabbath rest weekly, and to work toward a world which allows all to rest one day a week. Otherwise, we will continue to careen into oblivion. We will never rest, never pause, never cease, and thus, never count our blessings or be refreshed to enjoy the one life we have.

Let us not continue being slaves to busy-ness, and let us cease from telling others to be busy like us. Let us honor God by observing the ten commandments, especially the commandment to stop each week and rest for a day.

The Fourth of July is more than just a celebration of summertime — it's a time to celebrate our freedom and how far we have come.

- 1. The Declaration of Independence began as a letter to King George to explain why the Continental Congress voted to declare independence from Great Britain.
- The Declaration of Independence was started on July
 1776 and the Continental Congress approved the final wording on July 4. The American colonies were declared free and independent states.
- 3. The first Independence Day was celebrated on July 8, 1776 and the official signing took place on August 2.
- 4. 56 people signed the Declaration of Independence. Thomas Jefferson wrote the majority of it.
- 5. The first Independence Day on July 8, 1776 took place in Philadelphia. The White House celebrated Independence Day for the first time in 1804.
- 6. The Declaration of Independence has five parts. They are: the Preamble, the Statement of Human Rights, Charges Against Human Rights, Charges Against the King and Parliament, and the Statement of Separation and Signatures.
- According to census.gov, 2.5 million people celebrated the first Independence Day, compared to 316.2 million people today.
- 8. July 4 was officially declared a holiday in 1870, nearly one hundred years after the Declaration of Independence was written.
- 9. Currently, the oldest Independence Day celebration in the U.S. is held in Bristol, Rhode Island.
- 10. 2016 marks this year as the 240th Independence Day.


