Walking our dog has so many health benefits. I've been amazed, however, at how I can reflect on life and God while walking him as well.

When Monk was little, he would sniff around for squirrels and other critters. I'd chuckle to myself as he'd be on the scent, so he thought, while the squirrel was standing fifty feet away in the opposite direction. I thought Monk would eventually grow out of this practice, but no. Even today, he still was going in one direction while the squirrel was going in another.

A similar pattern can appear in our own faith journey. While we might not be hunting rabbits, we might flitter here and there thinking we are close to God but not actually encountering God's presence. Sadly, just because we age doesn't mean we are growing in wisdom with regards to our faith.

I grew up in a Christian tradition which valued reciting standard prayers from memory. Some of those prayers were repeated several times in a row. It all became very monotonous and boring. I dreamed of growing up, and growing out of such life draining practices. "Surely, our relationship with God is more dynamic than words printed on a page," I thought to myself.

The wisdom, which is missed with this thinking, is that we humans need spiritual practices to stay connected with God, the source our our well being. Now, certain spiritual practices might speak to some of us more than others, but it is important to have a daily discipline with which we stay close to God.

Now that we have celebrated Trinity Sunday, the many weeks of "Ordinary Time" begins. It's also the beginning of summer, when a thousand other things call for our time and attention. It is our hope and prayer for you to stay connected to God and growing in faith during this season. Worship, small groups, and Sunday School will still be happening. Our teachers will still be preparing lessons for us to connect and grow in God. The liturgical color for Ordinary Time is green. May the green symbolize our growth in spiritual wisdom, and not our desire to remain as spiritual newbies.




