As Pastor Kristi and I were walking our dog, Kristi lamented about how we celebrate Christmas so well, but we don't seem to give the same oomph to Easter. As we continued to talk, I thought of the Christmas song I loathe the most: "Santa Claus Is Coming to Town." The specific verse for my vitriol was "he knows if you've been bad or good, so be good for goodness sake!"

During the Ash Wednesday service, I did something different. Instead of placing a cross of ash on people's fore-heads, I placed it on the palm of their hands. I then asked them to try to clean off the ash on their own. All tried, but no one completely succeeded. All needed the water of grace to wash their hands clean.

We pay lip service to Paul's admonition that all have fallen short of the glory of God (Romans 3.23), but we often try to live as if we have never sinned, as if we didn't need grace. There are many reasons for this. Shame is the primary reason. Guilt says "I've done something bad" while Shame says "I am bad." All of us have had someone shame us in our lives, which then makes it tougher to admit when we have fallen short. We don't want to think we "are bad" (shame) so we fail to admit when we've done wrong (guilt).

The song mentioned earlier doesn't help us at all. It is about shame. Be good or be bad. If you are bad, you won't get anything good when Santa comes.

How is this related to Easter? It's simple. It shouldn't be a surprise how Christians have morphed God into Santa. We sing many more Christmas carols than we do Easter hymns. We have had the shame of Santa reinforced over, and over, and over again. Then, when it matters most, when we herald the ultimate good news - Jesus has conquered the grave and forgave us of our sins - we can't accept it. Oh, we can accept it in our brains. It is good head knowledge that we get to go to heaven, but what about our hearts? What about our souls? Do we feel forgiven? We may have felt forgiven when we accepted Christ into our hearts the first time, but what about now? Now, after we've fallen short again, and again, and again? How about now? After having tasted grace, how can God forgive me for falling short again?

It's so much more comfortable with the head knowledge of the gospel. It keeps us from having to deal with our shame that has been painfully tied to our guilt. I put the ash on the palm instead of the forehead to force us to look at what we have done, or failed to do. We have to confront our guilt, especially during this time of Lent. If we don't know our sins, we can't lament them, repent, and turn back to God.

Here's the good news! Christ died for us not because he had to, but because he loves us. It runs so counter to the belief that we have to be good in order to get good things. Easter is the celebration of the reversal of this logic. We have received good things, because God is good. May the second half of Lent be a time of joy for all of us. We have another opportunity to change, to repent, to try again. May we let go of our shame in order to confess our guilt. May we approach again the throne of grace, knowing our God is ready to save and forgive.


TAKE CARE OF MY CHURCH
