A Note from your Pastors:

For many of us under 50, Journey's song "Don't Stop Believin" is in our Golden Oldies playlist. As we begin the month of May, many are beginning the preparations for graduation celebrations. Whether it is in school, scouting, or other clubs, being promoted to the next level brings both a sense of accomplishment and a sense of the unknown. For us parents and grandparents, we might worry about our children and grandchildren as they continue on with their life journeys. We might wonder if they will stop believing, stop following the God whom we have tried so diligently to teach to them.

But here's the rub. We claim a God who is not a set of rules, but a living person - Jesus Christ. First and foremost, our faith life is a journey rather than a narrow, singular path. It is a journey because we are unique, and we follow a Person who loves us unconditionally.

If we are being honest with ourselves, few of us have stayed on a straight path from high school graduation until now. Career missteps, families created, health challenges - all of these things have made a once straight path crooked. Yet, when we release the notion of straight paths, we can often see the hand of God directing us, even when His direction took us off-roading. For Pastor Kristi and I, this off-roading came in our call to a specific seminary - the Methodist Theological School in Ohio, at a specific year - 2005. While the call we each heard was different, answering the call has enabled a new family to be born, and a partnership in ministry that has been rewarding. Looking back, we would have never been able to plan or predict where we'd be today, but we are confident God has been with us in our winding paths.

In the book of the prophet Ezekiel, the prophet had a vision of God leaving the temple and taking up residence with those who were exiled to Babylon. Not only is God on the move, God often goes ahead of us - preparing the way before we even see the path.

You see, we often feel like we are tempted to leave God behind when we graduate, when we move out of our parents' home, but that isn't the case. We don't, and can't, leave God behind. Rather, we often stop looking for the God who is always journeying with us. If we think of God as a set of rules, then yes, we often leave some of those rules behind. However, when we realize how God daily beckons us to discover His presence, we will regain and redevelop our sense of wonder for both God and God's living creation.

We can't promise anyone's path will be straight, narrow, and practical if they pursue God daily inthis fashion. What we can promise is that it will be a faithful response to the One who created us and loves us - every step of the way.
