A Note from your Pastor:

So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! 2 Corinthians 5.17 NRSV

As our children, grandchildren, and great grandchildren head back to school, we send them our love and prayers. We pray that every day will be an opportunity for their growth, both personally and professionally.

What about us? Do we still look for something new in our lives each day, or has life become tedious, monotonous, painful, or dreary? On the other hand, have new things become the bane of your existence? Perhaps you are tired of everything being new. "Can't we just go back to the old ways?"

The Greek word for "new" in the passage above is kainos, but like many Greek words, there are different English words or different understandings which can go with the word. First, "new" can mean unused or recently come into existence. I think the word, fresh, may apply here. Second, "new" can mean unknown or strange. Finally, "new" can mean the opposite of old.

Our level of fear toward something new will depend greatly on which of these three aspects we deem valid. Going in reverse, the highest fear comes with the last definition. Oftentimes, the new is portrayed as surpassing the old. As we all continue to age, the "threat" from the young continues to grow. Next, we naturally fear that which is unknown. When personal computers became commonplace in the 80s, many people older than me feared breaking them if they hit the wrong combination of keystrokes. I still hear some people fearing technology today. Finally, the least fearful aspect of new is the one first listed. Most of us would prefer fresh clothes, tools, supplies, bodies. It's not that we want an unknown body, we just wish ours would work as well as it used to.

So, what does all this have to do with the Bible verse? As you can imagine, our understanding of the passage depends on how we interpret the word "new." Is the person who is in Christ superior to others? Is the person who is in Christ strange and different to others? Or is the person who is in Christ refreshed for the work of ministry? It is my hope for us individually, as well as our church, that we will focus on this understanding of new as being refreshed. Let us pray during the month of September for refreshment, for our souls and for the church's soul. May God's Spirit enliven our spirits again so that we may become, once again, God's new creation.



If you have any old jeans, any size or color, please bring them to church for Tracy Arnold. Her mother's church turns them into rugs to raise money for missions.


