A Note from the Pastor:

As Christians, we typically think of salvation at Easter, when we walk with Jesus through his suffering, death, and resurrection. However, this is just one side of the coin. The other side is the season of Advent and Christmas.

This might seem strange to you - to think about salvation at Christmastime. It's ok to feel uncomfortable about it, but if we take a moment to ponder the birth of Christ, we realize that all work has to have a beginning, even the work of salvation.

It is written in the letter to the Hebrews, "For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sin." (Hebrews 4.15 NRSV) Had Jesus come as a fully grown adult male, this could not have been said about him. As it is, we have a difficult time believing Jesus is able to sympathize with our weaknesses. We like to make him more like God than human

Christmas defies our attempts to deny Jesus' humanity. We cannot avoid the fact infant Jesus needed diapers, needed to be breast-fed, needed the love of Mary, Joseph, family, and friends. This fully human Jesus needed all of the things we humans need: food, drink, clothing, shelter. The ancients called these needs "weaknesses" but we see them as normal needs for human existence.

In this respect, the Christmas story is our story. We all came from a human mother. We all swam in a human womb. We have lived our lives - our ups and our downs - in the midst of family, friends, and the wider community. We have received love, compassion, and care. It is our turn to offer those same gifts to others.

Why? Because God cares about the body. We are not souls trapped in flesh. We are fleshy souls. Our life depends on the health of both body and soul. Jesus demonstrated the need to merge body and soul when He chose to enter this world as a human infant. His saving work included the body along with the soul. Salvation includes both Christmas and Easter. May we be reminded of both sides of salvation every time we drop a coin into a kettle this season. May we strive to be like Christ, doing our part to help others find new life this season - both in body and in soul.




