A Note from the Pastor:

Last Sunday, the passage for the sermon was the story of the healing of blind Bartimaeus in the Gospel of Mark (10.46-52). I focused on the translation of anablepo, which can be translated as "see" or "see again." I chose to translate it as "see again," but for this reflection, I'd like to think about what it meant if Bartimaeus was born blind and was asking to have sight for the first time.

If Bartimaeus was indeed born blind, then what are some of the reasons he might have had for wanting the sense of sight? Well, the story itself gives us a clue. He was a beggar. In our culture, to make one's living by begging is not a reputation builder. For us, begging would be humiliating. If there was a way to not beg, we'd want it as well, regardless of the unintended consequences.

This question is still rattling around in my brain, however: "How do we know to want something when we've never had it to begin with?" How would someone who has never heard a sound know to want the sense of hearing? How would someone who is short know to want to be tall? I could go on and on, but it seems there is a common element in many questions like this. The element is comparison. We want to be like someone else. We see someone having something we don't have, and we want it. There is a darker side of this, too. If we have been demeaned, criticized, or attacked because we weren't tall enough, fast enough, have the correct ethnicity, et cetera, we may want something we don't have precisely because we want to end the torment we experience from the mouths and hands of others.

As I said in the sermon, what are our deepest desires? It could very well be to see, to hear, to taste, to talk. These are not bad things to desire. My desire in this article is to call us to do two things. First, are we truly taking the time to discern how our desires align with the desires of God, and second, are we conscious of the ways in which we may be contributing to the desires of others by our statements and actions regarding their supposed disability?

The first question is our inner journey. How are our desires being formed and reinforced? More importantly, how well do we accept our core selves? Are we at peace with who we are fundamentally?

The second question is our outer journey. How are we lifting up the spirits of those around us, especially those who are differently abled than we are? Do we intentionally or unintentionally make them feel inferior to us? Do we imply with our words or actions they are burdens to us? A simple example might suffice. I have heard repeated comments throughout my life regarding the cost involved in making sidewalks handicapped accessible. How, do you suppose, these words sound to those who are dependent on a wheelchair, but still desire to be independent human beings? Perhaps the crowd in the story was trying to silence Bartimaeus since he was calling attention to the ways in which society failed to care for those who weren't able to see - a society which left him to his own devices to earn a living, which sadly, was begging.

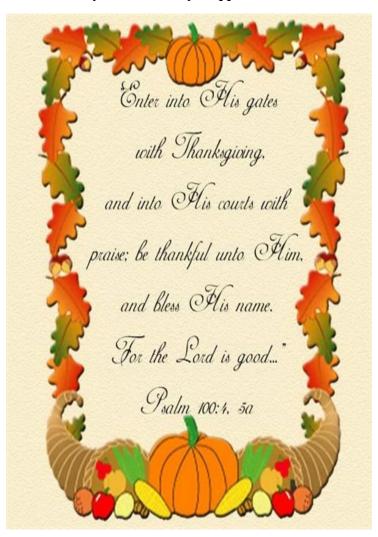
