A Note from your Pastors:

Psalm 34.18 "The Lord is near to the brokenhearted, and saves the crushed in spirit."

As pastors, my wife and I have ample opportunity to sit and pray with those with heavy hearts. The reasons for the sadness are many, but hearts broken by grief is our specialty. Not only have we lived through the loss of many loved ones, we have also spent much time learning how to counsel those who are grieving. We have seen what works, and we have seen what doesn't.

Many times, our theology, our thinking about the ways of God, come up short when tragedy strikes. Throughout centuries, we have often rationalized tragedy as part of God's will. While this is an option, it isn't a path Pastor Kristi and I tread. We are Methodists, and we believe in free will. We also believe that God doesn't send hardships to test us. It is written in James 1.13 "No one, when [tested], should say, "I am being [tested] by God"; for God cannot be [tested] by evil and he himself [tests] no one." NRSV, with "test" being a valid translation.

So, during times of grief and anguish, I turn to the Psalm 34.18. This passage is a direct contradiction to the belief that God blesses good people and curses bad people. Bad things happen to good people. The grace and the joy of this passage is our mighty God is near to us when sorrow and pain visits us. While the sorrow and pain aren't immediately lifted (after all, our grief is a direct reflection of how much we loved someone), our burdens can be made lighter through the presence of the Holy Spirit and the encouragement and support of others.

Pastor Kristi and I thank you for your prayers and encouragement during this difficult time for us.


