#See all the people: Reaching 100 New Guests in 2019

Thom Rainer and his staff did a fascinating national survey recently in which they found Eight out of Ten unchurched people said they would come to church if only someone would invite them. We all know personal invitation is actually the most effective way to reach new people in our community. We also know someone in our community or family who don't go to any church. As a church, we might do a great job of encouraging people to invite their friends, neighbors and Co-workers, but encouraging and equipping are two different things.

"#See all the people" is an attempt to ignite and inspire our church in the process of disciple-making. It is not waiting for people to come to us. It is about planting seeds, building relationships and knowing that once that happens, that really is the beginning of the disciple-making process. We can't disciple people with whom we're not in a relationship. We want to explore and capitalize on our relational capital. Just like other churches, we want to reach unreached and unchurched people. Normally the global churches worry a lot about fixing their building rather than about making disciples of Jesus Christ. The older we become we have a lot of things going on and it can be easy to lose focus.

If we want to be a rapid growing church, we should target seven weekly guests for every 100 people in attendance. That seems like a specific, measurable, attainable, realistic and time-based or trackable (SMART) goal. Even if we have two guests for each week at REUMC, we will have our goal met (reaching 100 guests) because just like any other year we do have 52 Sundays in 2019. What holds us back is not the lack of space, outdated social media presence or lack of facility, but it is an issue of mindset. A stuck mindset or insider mindset as some call it, but what we need in this hour is a right mindset. Setting a goal is a great thing but having a priority to reach the goal is another thing. Many times we see people accidentally, not intentionally. The act of intentionally planning for the guest will help solidify our priorities and create a healthy expectation. If teens find our church activities and service boring, irrelevant and disengaging the new visitors also will feel the same.

We were originally created for communities and formed for families. Nobody is required to fulfill his or her destiny alone. You were born for a purpose and we were made to belong. RiversEdge UMC would like to challenge each and everyone to join this challenge to invite and have 100 guests this year 2019. We are inviting people where they belong and see how God can change a life.

No matter what background, previous experience with church, I personally want each and everyone in our community to take this challenge to invite our friends and families. I also personally invite each one for this new launch of our new sermon series called "#See all the people" a 4 week series on Pressing Crowd, Expectant Crowd, Questioning Crowd and Astounded Crowd.


