### THE CASE FOR EASTER REVIVAL

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

One of our challenges today is to use this holy season to help others rejoice as we move together toward the remembrance of Good Friday and the great joy of an empty tomb. As we continue to unpack the season of Lent, do you see it as a time of sacrifice, surrender, renewal and revitalization? In the following season, we will continue to examine the biblical accounts of Jesus' resurrection and the impact of the empty tomb.

It is a perfect time to celebrate the new life that Christ offers to us. It is a great time to grow deeper in our faith and in our love of God. It is also the perfect time to reach a wider community as we share the joy of knowing the Lord through our words, actions and fellowship.

Helping people connect and stay connected to the church are two major challenges we face today. Some church growth experts call them "front door" and "back door" challenges. The "front door" refers to the act of reaching out to unchurched people. The "back door" covers those actions taken to help attendees grow and stay engaged long-term. Churches can't grow and reach their potential without new people attending. They also can't remain healthy without having fully engaged congregants.

Times are changing. The current technology revolution means most "front door" potential visitors check out a church's website or Facebook online page before deciding to attend. As a result, churches with little or no online presence are left with few "front door" attendees. Those churches tend to focus mostly on "back door" access by trying to increase the attendance of people who are already coming to church, though infrequently. Throughout history, many times revival has come through the back door. But, "front door" outreach approaches are still preferred. I believe an effective online presence is the "front door" of most growing churches in the 21st century and is the biggest "front door" the church has ever seen!

What does a growing church look like? To be a growing church, the number of first-time visitors over a year's time should be at least equal to the number of people we average in attendance each week. A typical growing church will continue to keep a large percentage of those guests in attendance as they mature into regular, active participants in the church. Do you know we have over 270 "members" who attend throughout the year, but our average attendance is less than 100? In addition, many of those in attendance have not taken membership in our church. Our attempt this year is to bring the same number of first-time visitors annually through our front door.

How do we migrate first-time visitors and casual attendees into actively engaged, steady attendees? We need to let them know we care and genuinely focus on welcoming them with an irresistible experience. We can then truly live up to the calling that we are to be a "caring community". It requires those who are the core members of the church to experience a revival.

The word 'revival' means to bring back to life, restore to consciousness or to restore to the previous condition. The revival in the biblical language is not emotionalism and is not evangelism. Rather, it is an intentional renewal of an individual's spiritual life as a functional part of a dedicated group of Christians. It is a heartfelt return to God and His Word. It makes a prodigal say to the father, "I have sinned". How can one be healed who is not sick, and be satisfied with the bread of life who is not hungry?

Unfortunately, everything in this modern age is shallow...the consequence is that men leap into religion, and then leap out again. "Un-humble they came to the church, un-humble they remained in it, and un-humble they go from it", said C.H. Spurgeon.

I pray that this season will open new doors in your lives and expand your experience of personal faith development. I also pray that it will enhance your lives through a focus on the historic spiritual disciplines that include prayer, study, fasting, service and a spirit of generosity.

Thanks for being a part of the RiversEdge United Methodist Church family! I celebrate your journey of faith and give thanks for the ways God is leading our church.
