REUMC - 2019

In the year 2019, RiversEdge has experienced new possibilities and some growing challenges. The year went so fast and the season of advent is already here. I personally want to thank God for all that He is doing.

As I was reflecting, I was amazed and thanked God for all the great things He did in the year 2019. The beginning of the year we started an alpha bible study and offered a campaign to reach 100 new guests. I personally don't know the number of people who visited our congregation, but I am sure there are many who came back to church and joined our congregation. The Unstuck Church assessment was truly an eye opener and a life changer. This helped us to find where our church currently is and we identified that we are in our maintenance stage. After this new awareness, we tried our best efforts to change our focus to shift our community to momentum growth phase and strategic growth phase. No ministry slips into a maintenance season intentionally, but this is the path every church drifts toward if intentional steps aren't taken to avoid it. This year our ministries focused more on the people who are already connected to the church than the people we are trying to reach.

The strategic development began by asking the difficult question such as WHY and why are we doing what we are doing to be an effective and vibrant community. We came up with 70 new ideas for our church. The wonderful part of it was all of them came from the people and from the local community. It was a bottom up approach to leadership. It was also an eye opening for us to know that out of 70, 40 some ideas we could implement with available existing resources. There are many who helped in that process and I truly appreciate all the servant leaders within our church.

As part of this revitalization process, we also received a miracle through Kim Blickenstaff. He is a wealthy investor who was baptized in our church and where spiritual legacy is connected. He came back to us and promised to give us financial investments for our expansion in taking care of all the improvement within the church and offered to build a new food pantry.

This year we also had two meetings with our community leaders. This was a gathering where around 30 people from our community who are the business leaders, School Superintendent/Principal, business owners, village board, Mayor and friends of Kim Blickenstaff gathered to brainstorm and celebrate. The best was this community initiative happened under the leadership of the church, and the community felt that the church is a welcoming community.

During last Easter service, we had 207 people in attendance. This was first time in few years we crossed our 200 mark in worship attendance. We started to see a steady progress thereafter.

As of now, we have more progress with our revitalization process and we are hoping to expand our outreach ministry by building a new food pantry and expanding our geographical and spiritual growth. We are also trying to take care of the business of the church and going to concentrate on the leadership development of the congregation. This year we also replaced our old thermal water furnace unit, which was more than 40 years old, removing over 10,000 lb. of metal from our building.

We started to strengthen our children's ministry this year in 2019. We invested our resources to re-create a new renovated place for our Sunday schools and trying out a new syllabus along with our new children's worship we call "Lighthouse Worship" and the Branding is on progress. We had a great VBS program during last summer where around 40 students from the community had a chance to learn the Word for a week. Today we have Sunday school for all ages starting with toddlers, kindergarten or preschool. We are still in the process of creating more furnished rooms available. We also learned about the immediate need in the Riverview Grade School and our church outside campaign launched a program to help and already started to take momentum which we call Riverview Kindergarten Assistance Boot camp. We also started a "sew powerful purse project" where we will be stitching purses for vulnerable girls in Zambia.

Our next target is to develop our leaders (leadership development -100) and a program to create an "exchange charity model" with our food pantry and community outreach ministries. We want to continue to create more sustainable partners and develop more trusted friends in the community by building bridges. We are also attempting to strengthen the spiritual aspects of our church by strengthening our relational capitals. Also want to continue to explore new and fresh expression of faith. Soon, we also want to see a young family support group start just like our O.U.R. soon.

Overall it was a great year; please continue to uphold the leadership in your prayers as we together continue to strive for excellence and God's kingdom representation in Spring Bay and beyond.

Although we can't go back and make a new start, we can start from now and make a new ending.

Thank you so much for all the leaders and we can't do any of it without your help, contribution and leadership.

May God continue to bless you and may God enlarge your territories.




