
Church has two powerful doors. The front door and the back door. Anyone who knows church growth, community sustainability, and vibrant growth for leadership strategy understands the importance of both doors. Some churches have wider backdoor or a wider front door. I personally believe sticky church is a time-tested strategy for us. To create a sticky church, we have a lot to learn from the honeybee hive. When I was a teenager, I used to have honey bee nest and growing up I used to have a lot of fun with them.

Firstly, the church and the honeybee hive know that they are always **better and stronger together.** The queen, the worker bees and drones they all need each other to survive and thrive. Single individual or a group of individuals are more important than any other. A leader without his team is not a leader. We need to understand the importance of each member in our family unit. We all matter as an individual. Everything we can't do it alone, can be done together. In the leadership they call this key concept with a fancy title Inter-departmental collaboration. A successful team is a group of many hands but one mind. A healthy organization needs development, marketing, customer service, finance, logistic and many other teams in operation. In the life of our church, each team are important and You matter. It takes time to recognize success and celebrate accomplishments, lift one another up and come together to solve our challenges and fulfill our vision and mission. Remember, if one person succeeds, we all succeed. The strength of a chain is as strong as its weakest link. In other words, REUMC can only be strong from the weakest or least powerful person.

Secondly, honeybee hive **knows the importance of clear and persistent communication**. Clear and persistent communication flows between each member of the team, and it is a crucial aspect for his or her own systemic survival. The bees normally communicate between each other with elaborate dances. The best way to communicate is to create intentionality to it. It is their secret weapon and it can be our too. It is a great task to create a consistent guideline for communication.

Thirdly, they do **what is the priority.** Each of us has unique skills, passion, talents and gifts. The bees have different jobs. They include cleaning the nest, managing the temperature, caring for the queen, feeding the younger bees, guarding the hive's entrance, construction, maintenance, and repair of structures within the hive, gathering food, managing reproduction and more. They have divided jobs and skills based on age and experience. This involves one's creativity, willingness and availability. According to modern science the oldest bees in the fossil record are 100 million years old. Their ability to survive in the natural world has hundreds of times longer than we human beings. This is a well-tested model for our prosperity, success and growth.

In reality, honeybee is the world's most important single species. They pollinate and ensure human beings and animals have the food they need to survive. If there were no honeybees, the world will not have broccoli, berries, apples, cucumbers and lots of other foods. Even though they have a fairly short life span, they have a great job or purpose to fulfill. Ultimately, we have a lot to learn from them and in order for us to fulfill our mission and purpose we need to be primarily a sticky church.
