The childhood rhyme Mary had a little lamb is based on an incident in the life of Mary Sawyer of Sterling, Massachusetts when her lamb followed her to school one day. The lambs at school being frowned on by the educational establishment, the teacher kicked the lamb out, but Mary's little lamb waited for her outside the school. What makes the lamb love Mary so much asked her classmates? Mary Loves the lamb, you know the teacher replies. Saying that kindness to animals will gain their loyalty. As documented by poet Sarah Joseph Hale, the story published in 1830. According to the New England historical society, the story goes deeper than that. Sawyer persuaded her parents to allow her to hand raise the lamb after its being rejected by its mother.

He will wrap it up with warm cloths and hold it close enough to hear a heartbeat. When the lamb reaches certain age and become strong the shepherd will place it back in the field with the rest of the flock. Later on when the shepherd comes in the morning to check on his flock the first one to approach the shepherd will be the bummer lamb. They know his voice and they can smell.

Christ calls himself the good shepherd. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out to new pastures. A good shepherd always walks ahead of them, and they follow him because they know his voice. We are loved, even though at one point we were a bummer lamb. The world might have rejected us, called us unworthy, taken our opportunities and privileges but remember we have a good shepherd who takes care of bummer lamb.

Our condition is not our conclusion. It is not all over. Your dreams are the beginning of what God can do in your life. Where I am today is not my destiny. Today's struggle is not an end in itself. I will come out of this and I am not a victim but I am a victor. Dream big, start a new life in Christ and forgiveness says you are given another chance to make a new start. If you are reading this let me promise you it is not all over, there is life beyond our present struggle. Our condition is not our conclusion.


VOLUNTEER needed to power wash the bricks surrounding the base hold the old church bell on west side of church; also, the bricks on the outside of the church building's west and north side.




